Hospitality Food and Beverage

Hospitality is an accredited subject which means students who successfully complete the course will not only gain their HSC but also Certificate II in Hospitality, a qualification recognised throughout Australia.

It also contributes towards an ATAR for those students who sit the Hospitality HSC examination. The HSC exam is optional.

Hospitality is a practical based course. At Camden Haven High School we specialise in training students in the Food and Beverage stream of the certificate. All students have full access to a wide range of commercial equipment, café, espresso machine and restaurant area.

In addition, the opportunity to obtain a certificate for the Responsible Service and Alcohol (RSA) and Responsible Conduct of Gambling (RCG) is available

Students undertaking the 240 hours course study:

- Interact with customers
- Work effectively with others
- Prepare and serve non-alcoholic beverages
- Prepare and serve espresso coffee
- Serve food and beverage
- Use hygienic practices for food safety
- Participate in safe work practices
- Participate in safe food handling practices
- Prepare and present sandwiches
- Show social and cultural sensitivity
- Maintain quality of perishable items
- Source and use information on the hospitality industry
- Provide first aid
- Use hospitality skills effectively

A uniform is required for this course consisting of:

- Black trousers and polo shirt
- Black half apron and hat
- Black closed in leather shoes

This is available to hire through the Home Economics Department.

Hospitality students will undertake 70 hours of work placement throughout years 11 and 12. Local businesses provide additional training and hands on experience to further develop student's learning.
