Continuity of Education

Key messages and information for cascade to teams

The Education Continuity Taskforce is responsible for ensuring the continuity of education for students, regardless of whether they are learning in the classroom or remotely.

A key focus of our work has been the development of the <u>Learning from Home</u> hub - a repository of information, resources and key information to guide principals, teachers, parents and carers in the delivery of learning for students at school or remotely.

Another key focus has been <u>professional learning for staff</u> – whether scheduled sessions or via anywhere, anytime on-demand learning.

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Urgent Action Required

Key Messages

New anywhere, anytime on-demand teacher professional learning is available along with scheduled live leadership sessions.

A range of new curriculum, technology and leadership based PL modules are now available in MyPL and on the <u>Learning from home</u> hub under the new <u>Learning on demand section</u>.

Additional modules will be progressively added over the next 24 hours so please keep checking the site.

Further Information

Most sessions last between 30-60 minutes and include, but not limited to:

- Incorporating explicit teaching strategies when learning from home;
- Maintaining a focus on literacy and numeracy;
- How to support parents with their child's literacy and numeracy learning;
- How to use Microsoft Learning Tools to support students with reading and writing difficulties; and
- Capturing student creativity with iPad; developing skills and knowledge in how to develop student learning both online and offline.

New technology facilities are now available to enable all schools to pre-record a school assembly and upload it to their school website or social channel.
